Postlude

*Norwich Cathedral* was established by Bishop Herbert de Losinga, who laid its foundation stone in 1096 A.D. The Cathedral had progressed far enough to be consecrated in 1101, and surprisingly was finally completed in 1145, only fifty years later. This was due in part to the wealth of Bishop de Losinga and to that of Norwich, which at that time was England's second largest city. A Benedictine monastery and Bishop's Palace were also built at this time. Since that time, storms and political upheaval have caused the Cathedral, its Cloister and other buildings to be repaired and rebuilt. Today it serves more than 400,000 visitors each year, continuing its founding traditions of worship, education and hospitality.
