Music Notes: Paul Hindemith 1895-1963 was a German composer first known as a violinist, and then a composer and teacher at the Berlin State Conservatory. His works include an opera, as well as instrumental, vocal, orchestral and keyboard music. His music was banned by the Nazi regime, and thus from 1942-1953 he taught at Yale University. *Ned Rorem (1923 -)* is one of America's most famous composers. "Arise, Shine" was commissioned by Christ Church Cathedral, Trinity Church and Saint James's Church – all of Hartford, Connecticut – for the 1977 Regional Convention of the American Guild of Organists in Hartford. "Sing My Soul" is part of a set of three hymn anthems written for the former Master of Music of Washington's National Cathedral – Paul Calloway. For more than fifty years, *George Thalben-Ball 1896-1987*, was the Organist and Master of the Choir at London's famed Temple Church.
