MUSIC NOTES: Arthur Wills 1926 -, was the Organist and Choirmaster of Ely Cathedral from 1958-1990, and also a Professor at the Royal Academy of Music. Harold Friedell (1905-1958) was the Organist of St. Bartholomew's Church on Park Avenue in New York City. His son, David, was the organist and choirmaster with our Rector, Jim Purdy, at St. Bernard's Church in Bernardsville, New Jersey and a classmate of mine in graduate school. J. S. Bach's (1685-1750) Cantata 75 is for the first Sunday after Trinity. It is one of his grandest and was the first such work written after his appointment as Cantor to St. Thomas Church in Leipzig.
