MUSIC NOTES: Charles Callahan (1951 -) has composed a number of choral and organ works, including commissions for the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis. He resides in Orwell, Vermont and directs the Vermont Conservatory of Music. Jack Noble White (1938 -) is the parish musician for the Episcopal Church of the Holy Apostles, Ft. Worth, Texas. George Thalben-Ball 1896-1987 was the Organist and Choirmaster of London's famed Temple Church for more than 50 years. Ludovico Viadana 1560-1627 was born near Mantua, Italy and became a friar in the Franciscan Order. He served a number of cathedral churches in Italy during his lifetime and published 22 volumes of choral music. As a composer, he played a significant role in the transition from Renaissance to Baroque music.
