MUSIC NOTES: Jean Berger 1909-2002 was born in Germany and received a musical doctorate from Heidelberg University. Fleeing the Nazi regime in Germany, he spent from 1933-1939 in Paris and from 1939 – 1941 in Rio de Janeiro. He emigrated to the United States in 1941, becoming an American citizen in 1943. His teaching career took him to Middlebury College in Vermont, the University of Illinois at Urbana, the University of Colorado in Boulder and Colorado Woman’s College in Denver.
