*Music Notes:* Sigfrid Karg-Elert 1877-1933 was a German composer of considerable fame in the early part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, whose works include chamber and orchestral music, choral works, lieder, and pieces for piano and for organ. . Ned Rorem (1923 -) is one of America's most famous composers. "Arise, Shine" was commissioned by Christ Church Cathedral, Trinity Church and Saint James's Church – all of Hartford, Connecticut – for the 1977 Regional Convention of the American Guild of Organists in Hartford. "All Glorious God" is part of a set of three hymn anthems written for the former Master of Music of Washington's National Cathedral – Paul Calloway.
