MUSIC NOTES: John Ireland (1879-1962) was born in Bowdon, England. Bowdon has special significance for Saint Peter’s Church. Our parishioner, Philip Barnes is from there, and the parish church – St. Mary the Virgin – was host to our choir in the summer of 2000. William H. Harris 1883-1973 was born and died in London. Educated at the Royal College of Music, he was successively the organist at New College, Oxford (1919), Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford (1928) and St. George’s Chapel, Windsor Castle (1933-1961.) Henry Loosemore ?-1670 was the organist of King’s College, Cambridge from 1627 until his death. He composed Service music and more than 30 anthems, most of which remain in manuscript form and often incomplete.
