*MUSIC NOTES: Hermann Schroeder 1904-1984* was born and died in Germany. Educated at the Hochschule für Musik in Cologne, he later became a Professor at the school as well as conductor of the Cologne Bach Society. The majority of his compositions were organ and choral, principally for the church. The Offertory Anthem, *Here O My Lord* was written in August, 2001, for the men of the St. Peter’s Choir. The Communion Motet is one of a set of two communion motets written for the St. Peter’s Choir in July and August of 1993.
