*MUSIC NOTES: Diderik Buxtehude (1637-1707) is the organist and composer that J. S. Bach walked 200 miles to study and to hear play. His organ, choral and instrumental works are some of the most important of the period. Antonio Caldara 1670-1736, a composer of operas, oratorios and cantatas, was born in Venice. His career took him to Mantua, Barcelona, Rome and Vienna. Peter Philips 1560-1628 began his musical studies as a chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral in London. In 1582, because of his Catholicism, he left England for good, living initially in Flanders and Rome. He eventually made his way to the Netherlands and later to Brussels. He was considered a virtuoso keyboard player and composed a large amount of choral music.*
